

The opening line of the book-- It is a truth universally acknowledged, that a single man in possession of a good fortune, must be in want of a wife, stands as one of the most famous first lines in literature.

It was a refreshing time. It helped them to analyse the merits and demerits of man-made structures. The trip ended with a group photo and obviously the sumptuous food shared by the students.


